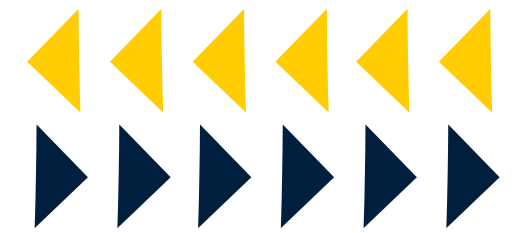
FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

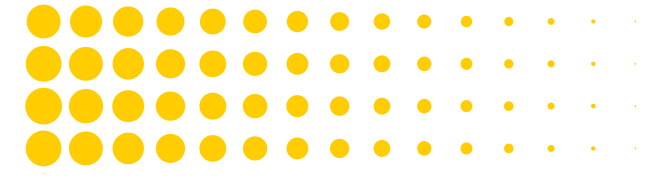
FROM THE PRESIDENT

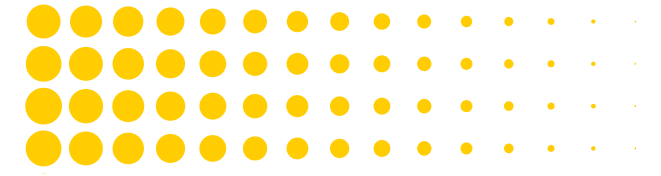

- **Successfully assembled and led an award-winning leadership team that delivered exceptional results throughout 2025. Under this collective effort, the Dayton Branch NAACP earned the prestigious Thalheimer Award for Programs and Publications for the twelfth consecutive year, further solidifying our branch as a national standard for organizational excellence**
- **Demonstrated strong fiscal stewardship, achieving a budget surplus of \$6,668.81 in 2025. From January 1, 2007, through December 31, 2025, the Branch has maintained a cumulative budget surplus of \$258,757, reflecting disciplined financial management and a long history of operational sustainability. Have raised \$3.6M since my first term commenced on January 1, 2007.**
- **Personally strengthened membership engagement and revenue through the successful recruitment of 122 new or renewed memberships, generating \$16,660 in membership funds in 2025. Membership totals include: 26 Youth Memberships; 21 Regular Memberships; 59 Subscribing Life Memberships; and 16 Fully-Paid Life Memberships.**

- **Study Housing Conditions in the Local Community** – Evaluated neighborhood concerns by examining issues such as illegal business activity at residential properties, displacement risks, and vacant or blighted homes to better understand housing conditions affecting Dayton residents.
- **Receive and Address Complaints of Discrimination** – Responded to resident concerns involving unfair housing practices and potential displacement, conducting follow-ups, verifying facts, and helping individuals understand their rental or homeownership options.
- **Oppose Restrictive or Unfair Housing Practices** – Advocated for equitable zoning and development by moderating the Zoning & Housing Solutions Forum, elevating discussions on fair housing, affordability challenges, and policies impacting underserved communities.
- **Disseminate Information & Provide Assistance to Eliminate Discrimination** – Delivered direct outreach at community events, including the Housing Resource Connection Fair and the IBROC launch, connecting residents with legal, financial, and homeownership resources that reduce barriers and prevent housing discrimination.
- **Build Partnerships That Advance Fair Housing** – Strengthened community alliances, including collaboration with D.O.I.T. to support an affordable cottage-style housing plan priced between \$60K and \$120K, increasing accessible homeownership opportunities for low- to moderate-income residents.

- **Moderated a Town Hall titled “Empowering Women, Empowering Communities.” The program featured 10 leaders of African American, women-led organizations who shared insights about their missions, highlighted the critical work they continue to lead, engaged potential new members, and explored opportunities to strengthen collective impact across the Dayton community. The panelists also emphasized the vital importance of voting and civic engagement, and discussed ways to elevate voter education, mobilization, and participation within the communities we serve.**

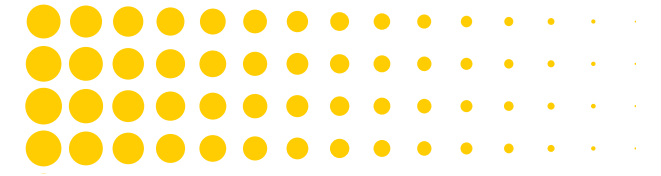

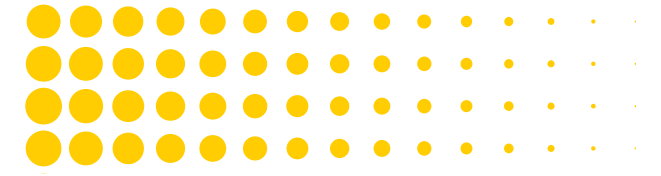

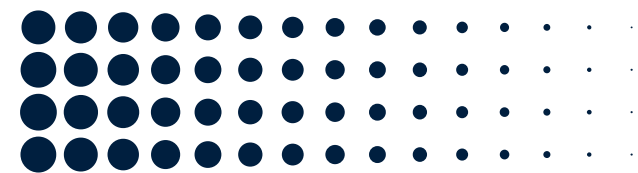
